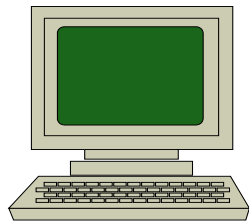
## River Ridge Winter Program and Concerts

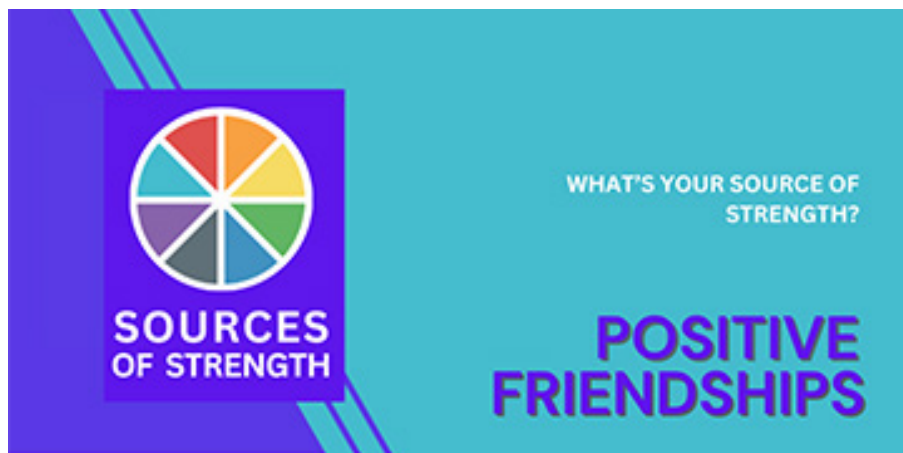

### Rules:

1. Students are not required to be in school until their first scheduled exam. Once in school, students are to stay until exams are completed for the day. Students should report to study hall if between classes with exams. Seniors have open campus for lunch but MUST sign in and out from office if they leave the campus.
2. All students should sign in if they arrive after 8:00 AM. Students should sign out if they leave before 3:25 PM. Students that arrive late or leave before the end of the last hour of the day should have signed permission slips turned into office by Tuesday, January 16.
3. A student may not leave the exam area until the 90-minute period is over. There will be no loitering in the hallways. Teachers will keep students in their room.
4. Students are expected to be in the classroom on time when the bell rings to begin the exam.
5. Any student missing any exam time must make arrangements with the teacher for make-up time. Grades are due to the office by Monday, January 22 at 8:00 AM.

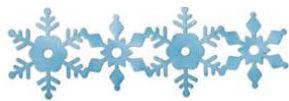

You may apply for **open enrollment** from **February 5 - April 30, 2024**

### What is Public School Open Enrollment?

The inter-district public school open enrollment program allows parents to apply for their children to attend public school in a school district other than the one in which they reside.

### Who may participate in open enrollment?

Any Wisconsin resident in 4K to grade 12 may apply to attend a nonresident school district under the open enrollment program. However, a child may transfer to a nonresident school district for early childhood education or 4K only if the child's resident school district offers the same type of program and only if the child is eligible for that program in the resident school district.

### How and when may parents apply?

The open enrollment application period for the 2024-2025 school year is from February 5 -April 30, 2024. The application period closes at 4:00 p.m. on April 30, 2024. Late applications will not be accepted for any reason.

Parents may apply online at <https://dpi.wi.gov/oe>.

### Can I apply to a virtual charter school under open enrollment?

A pupil may only open enroll to an online/virtual school if: (1) the school has been created as a virtual charter school that meets the requirements of the charter school law [Wis. Stats. 118.40 (8)] or (2) the pupil is required to physically attend school in the nonresident school district every day that school is in session. Other important things to know about applying to virtual charter schools:

\*A virtual charter school is not homeschooling. Pupils attending

virtual charter schools are public school pupils.

\* You must know the nonresident school district in which the virtual charter school is located. If you have any questions about this, call the virtual charter school.

\* You must know your resident school district in order to apply.

\* A list of virtual charter schools may be found at <https://dpi.wi.gov/sms/charter-schools/virtual-charter-schools>.

### Can an application be rejected?

Yes. Nonresident school districts may deny an application if regular or special education space is not available for the pupil; special education or related services are not available; or if the pupil has been referred for a special education evaluation but has not yet been evaluated. Nonresident school districts may also deny an application if the pupil has been expelled during the current or preceding two years for certain violent conduct or if the pupil was habitually truant from the nonresident school district during any semester in the current or previous school year.

If there are more applications than spaces, pupils must be selected randomly, after giving preference to pupils already attending school in the nonresident school district and siblings of currently-attending pupils.

Some school districts establish waiting lists to fill unused spaces, but others do not.

### Can a resident district prevent a pupil from leaving?

Yes, in limited circumstances. A resident district can deny a pupil's application for an invalid application (early or late application or missing information), ineligibility due to age (too young or too old), or if the resident district does not offer the same type of prekindergarten, four-year-old kindergarten, or early childhood program as the nonresident district or the pupil is not eligible for the program in the resident district. These are also reasons that a nonresident district can deny an application.

### Can parents appeal if an application is denied?

Parents whose applications are denied may appeal to the DPI within 30 days of the denial. State law requires the DPI to uphold the school district's decision unless DPI finds that the decision was arbitrary or unreasonable. The DPI's decision may be appealed to circuit court.

### Must pupils reapply every year?

Once a pupil is accepted into a nonresident school district, the pupil may continue to attend that district without reapplication except that:

\*The nonresident district may require a pupil to reapply one time—at the beginning of middle school, junior high or high school.

\*A pupil may be returned to the resident school district if the special education required in a new or revised IEP is not available in the nonresident district or there is no space.

### *Open Enrollment Continues*

\*A pupil who has become habitually truant in the nonresident district may be returned to the resident district.

### **Is there a cost for parents to participate in the open enrollment program?**

There is no tuition cost to parents for participation in open enrollment. Parents of open enrolled pupils may be charged the same fees as resident pupils.

### **Who is responsible for transportation?**

Parents are responsible for transporting their children to and from school. If transportation is required in the IEP for a child with a disability, it must be provided by the nonresident district. School districts may provide transportation to open enrollment pupils if they wish. Usually, if transportation is provided, parents must transport the pupil to a location in the nonresident district.

Low-income parents may apply to the DPI at the end of the school year for partial reimbursement of their transportation costs.

### **Can a parent select a specific school in the pupil's nonresident school district?**

Yes. A parent may request a specific school or program in the nonresident district. However, assignment to the requested school or program is not guaranteed and your pupil may be assigned to a different school other than the one requested. It is up to each nonresident district to determine a pupil's school assignment.

### **Can an open enrolled pupil participate in sports and other extra-curricular activities in the nonresident school district?**

Open enrolled pupils have the same rights and responsibilities as resident pupils.

Inter-scholastic athletics are governed by the Wisconsin Interscholastic Athletic Association (WIAA), which has rules concerning transfer pupils. Parents should check with the school district's athletic director about eligibility.

I. Call to Order- Board president Ken Nies called meeting to order at 6:00 PM

II. Roll Call- Present; Ken Nies, Jason Cathman, Aaron Stagman, Kirk Hamann, Josh Copsey, Adam Guthrie, Megan Kussmaul

III. Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

IV. Statement of Notice- Board President, Kenny Nies approved the posting and called the meeting official.

V. Appearances – No public appearances.

VI. Approval of Minutes

A. October 11, 2023, Regular Board Meeting Minutes and October 25, 2023, Special Board Minutes. Motion to approve the minutes was made by Jason Cathman and seconded by Megan Kussmaul. Motion passed on a voice vote.

VII. Reports

A. Finance – Tracy Stagman

i. Financial statements, receipts, and expenditures – Tracy Stagman presented the financial statements, receipts, and expenditures for October 2023. Aaron Stagman made a motion to approve the financial statements and expenditures pending an audit of the 2023/2024 year of revenues of \$237,807.76 and expenditures of \$1,698,902.73. Jason Cathman seconded the motion. Motion passed on a 7-0 roll call vote.

B. Buildings and Grounds Report

i. Maintenance Directors Report, Jim talked about the roof project and that we are moving forward with a new engineer Unified Theory (UTI) for the project.

C. Superintendent's Report, the board watched presentations from students who were on the Washington D.C. trip. Also watched a presentation from three 4th graders on cubbies for the

elementary wing. Clay talked about different events that happened in the school during October. Also presented was the application for the competitive Stronger Connection Grant. If successful, this grant would fund an at-risk coordinator, paid counseling sessions for students and professional development for a two-year period of time.

B. Operating Referendum Discussion: Reviewed the needs of the district.
