



Youth Risk Behavior Survey

Our school is taking part in the Youth Risk Behavior Survey sponsored by the Department of Public Instruction. The survey will ask about health behaviors that keep young people healthy, as well as behaviors that result in unintentional and intentional injuries, tobacco use, and alcohol and other drug use. It will also ask about bullying, sexual risk behaviors (mostly for high school students), online risk behaviors, stress and anxiety, self-harm, dietary behavior and physical activity. It also focuses on positive things like strong connections to the school and to other people. Students in grades 6-12 will be asked to fill out an anonymous, online questionnaire that takes about 25-35 minutes to complete. They will take the survey during regular class time.

Complete information and details were either e-mailed or mailed to all parents/guardians. If you did not receive that information, please contact Ms. Townsend at the high school or Mrs. Fohey at the middle school. If you do not want your child to take part in the survey, please sign the form that was sent to you and return to school by October 22, 2021.

WKM Counseling Services Offered at River Ridge

WKM Counseling will once again be offering mental health services to the River Ridge Community during the 2021-22 school year. A licensed therapist will come to River Ridge one day a week to meet with clients. If you feel your son or daughter would benefit from these services, please contact Caron Townsend or Kam Fohey.

ACP Senior Conferences

Seniors are in the process of completing their senior conferences with Ms. Townsend this month. Topics discussed in a conference include academic and career plans (ACP), college entrance requirements, choosing a college, internet resources, campus visits, college application procedures, financial aid/scholarships, and a senior timetable. They will be given a variety of publications full of information to help them move along in the ACP process.

“One-Liners” Distributed Monthly

Every month, the seniors and parents are e-mailed a bulletin called the “One-Liner.” This publication comes from the School Counseling office and includes information on financial aid and scholarships, campus preview days, ACT dates, career days, job market information, and much more. Financial Aid Process

The recommended window to work on and submit the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) form is October 1-December 1. For the 2021-22 FAFSA, students will report income information from two years prior, which in this case is 2020 income information; two tax years before the beginning of the school year.

The financial aid advisor from Southwest Technical College will help you through the maze of the application process.



Senior Graduation Information

PSAT

The PSAT will be administered to juniors on October 13, 2021. This is a 4-year college-bound assessment that compares a student's math and verbal ability to other college-bound juniors in the nation. This assessment also prepares students for other college entrance exams, provides them with an estimated SAT & ACT score as well as qualifies them for a National Merit Scholarship.

I. Call to order – Board President, Kenny Nies called the meeting to order at 5:33 PM

II. Roll Call – Present; Jason Cathman, Cory Moravits, Aaron Stagman, Adam Guthrie, Kirk Hamann, Josh Copsy. Absent; Kenny Nies.

III. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

IV. Statement of notice – Board Vice President, Jason Cathman approved the posting and called the meeting official

V. Appearances – There were no public appearances.

VI. Approval of Minutes

- A) June 2, 2021 Special Board Meeting Minutes
- B) June 16, 2021 Regular Board Meeting Minutes
- C) Kirk Hamann made a motion to approve the minutes. Adam Guthrie seconded the motion and it passed on a 6-0 voice vote.

VII. Reports

- A) Finance – Tracy Stagman
 - i. Financial statements, receipts, and expenditures – Business Manager, Tracy Stagman presented the financial statements, receipts, and expenditures for June 2021. Cory Moravits made a motion to approve the financial statement pending the audit of 21/22 for revenues of \$251,031.88 and expenditures of \$812,564.99. Aaron Stagman seconded the motion and it passed on a 6-0 roll call vote.
