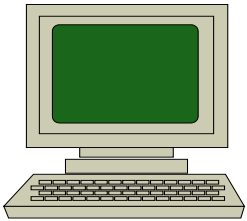

FINANCIAL AID PROCESS

The recommended window to work on and submit the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) form is October 1-December 1. For the 2023-24 FAFSA, students will report income information from two years prior, which in this case is 2021 income information: two tax years before the beginning of the school year.

This year's River Ridge Financial Aid will be on Wednesday, October 19 at 7:00 PM in the multipurpose room. The financial aid advisor from Southwest Technical College will help you through the maze of the application process.

ACP SENIOR CONFERENCES

Seniors are in the process of completing their senior conferences with Ms. Townsend this month. Topics discussed in a conference include academic and career plans (ACP), college entrance requirements, choosing a college, internet resources, campus visits, college application procedures, financial aid/scholarships, and a senior timetable. They will be provided a lot of information to help them move along in the ACP process.



SENIOR GRADUATION INFORMATION

The Jostens Rep was here September 29 to provide information & packets on graduation items. If your son or daughter missed the presentation, packets are available in Ms. Townsend's office.

"ONE-LINERS" DISTRIBUTED MONTHLY

Every month, the seniors & parents are e-mailed a bulletin called the "One-Liner". This publication comes from the School Counseling office and includes information on financial aid and scholarships, campus preview days, ACT dates, career days, job market information, and much more. This is a helpful publication for parents to read as well. It is also posted on our school website under school counseling.

PSAT

The PSAT will be administered to juniors on October 12, 2022. This is a 4-year college-bound assessment that compares a student's math and verbal ability to other college-bound juniors in the nation. This assessment also prepares students for other college entrance exams, provides them with an estimated SAT & ACT score as well as qualifies them for a National Merit Scholarship.

EDUCATION FAIR

Juniors will be attending the Wisconsin Education Fairs at UW-Platteville on October 17, 2022. Approximately 100 colleges, universities, military branches, and specialty schools will participate in the college fair. This will be a great opportunity for our juniors to gather information and ask questions about post-secondary options. This is voluntary and only juniors who are interested will have the opportunity to register and attend.

Juniors were also given their ACT Aspire results that they took last spring. These results provide information on the student's college readiness, career readiness, predicted ACT score range as well as national percentile ranks.


