

Badger State is a weeklong camp held in the summer for rising high school juniors. Its focus is providing young leaders across the state of Wisconsin with opportunities for leadership development, education and personal growth. Students are able to run for various elected positions at the city, county, and state level to form a fully functioning mock government, while learning about being a good citizen.

#### **ACP Senior Conferences**

Seniors are in the process of their senior conferences with Ms. Townsend this month. Topics discussed in a conference include academic and career plans (ACP), college entrance requirements, choosing a college, campus visits, college application procedures, financial aid/scholarships, and a senior timetable. They will be provided with a lot of information to help them move along in the ACP process.

### "One-Liners" Distributed Monthly

Every month, the seniors and parents are e-mailed a bulletin called the "One-Liner." This publication comes from the School Counseling office and includes information on financial aid and scholarships, campus preview days, ACT dates, career days, job market information, and much more. This is a helpful publication for parents to read as well.

#### **PSAT**

The PSAT will be administered to juniors on October 9, 2024. This is a 4-year college-bound assessment that compares a student's math and verbal ability to other college-bound juniors in the nation. This assessment also prepares students for other college entrance exams, provides them with an estimated SAT and ACT score as well as qualifies them for a National Merit Scholarship.

#### **Education Fair**

Juniors will be given the opportunity to attend the Wisconsin Education Fair at UW-Platteville on October 4, 2024.

Approximately 100 colleges, universities, military branches, and specialty schools will participate in the college fair. This will be a great opportunity for our juniors to gather information and ask questions about post-secondary options. This is voluntary and only juniors who are interested will have the opportunity to register and attend.


#### **Senior Graduation Information**

A huge thanks to our volunteers! Without you, these fun events would not be possible. We appreciate everyone's participation and support!



Dear Parent/Guardian,

The Grant County Health Department will be giving influenza vaccine at your child's school on **Wednesday, October 16th**. The influenza vaccine is **free for children 18 and under.** If you do not want your child to receive the influenza vaccine, do not return the consent form to the school.

Please note: Your child must be able to sit on a chair independently to receive the vaccine. To keep everyone safe, we will not administer the vaccine to a combative child. If your child needs a parent/caregiver present due to comfort in order to receive the vaccine, please accompany your child.

#### To have your child receive the immunization at school:

- Read the Influenza Vaccine Information Statement by scanning the QR Code with your smart phone camera
- 2. Fill out the consent form for your child and return it to the school.



\*\*If your child is 9 years and under and has **never** had influenza vaccine before, they need two doses of influenza vaccine. We will be going to the school only once, so if your child needs a second dose, please contact the Health Department for options or your own medical provider. There must be 4 weeks between the first and second dose.

- I. Call to Order- Board president Ken Nies called meeting to order at 6:00 PM
- II. Roll Call- Present; Ken Nies, Jason Cathman, Josh Copsey, Adam Guthrie, Jeff Thornton, Kirk Hamann. Absent Megan Kussmaul
- III. Pledge of Allegiance was recited.
- IV. Statement of Notice- Board President, Kenny Nies approved the posting and called the meeting official.
- V. Appearances None
- VI. Approval of Minutes
  - A. July 10, 2024, Regular Board Meeting Minutes
  - B. July 17, 2024, Special Board Meeting Minutes
  - C. August 7, 2024, Special Board Meeting Minutes
    - i. Jeff Thornton made a motion to approve the minutes, seconded by Jason Cathman. Motion passed on a voice vote.

#### VII. Reports

#### A. Finance

- i. Financial statements, receipts, and expenditures Clay Koenig presented the financial statements, receipts and expenditures for July 2024. Adam Guthrie made a motion to approve the financial statements and expenditures pending an audit of 2023/2024 year of revenues of \$735,013.98 and expenditures of \$1,404,580.24. Josh Copsey seconded the motion. Motion passed on a 6-0 roll call vote.
- B. Buildings and Grounds Report
  - i. Maintenance Director's Report Jim reported that RRAP donated wood chips around the playgrounds and that they were all in place for the upcoming school year.

#### VIII. New Business

#### A. Snow Removal Bid

- i. Two bids were received for snow removal and after some discussion Adam Guthrie made a motion to accept the bid from Williams Landscaping & Outdoor Maintenance LLC, seconded by Kirk Hamann. Motion carried on a 6-0 roll call vote.
