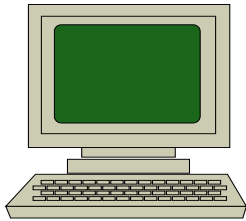
Football Team Qualifies for Playoffs

From fishing and learning about animal tracks to building shelters and making bannock bread, the groups had a blast on their second day at Wyalusing.

At their stations, the groups performed their skits and their chants, and every single one of them was super funny. They rehearsed since day one, and with the help of their counselors they put on quite the show. One group even made their own edition of the “It’s Corn” song!

That very night, everyone gathered around the campfire in the camp’s amphitheater and made s’mores, all while drinking root beer and cream soda.

They heard the terrifying tale of a ghost that haunts Wyalusing to this day. There have been many spooky occurrences in the past, and there was even a little paranormal activity this time around as well!

After another good night’s sleep (though there might’ve been some nightmares about the ghost), another breakfast and a Flag Ceremony, Denny Moris visited the camp and taught the sixth graders about metal detectors and dowsing rods.

They played a few fun games organized by Mr. Redman and Mr. Breuer. After that, they went on a second hike along the Maple Leaf Trail, where they visited another cave with a waterfall! Students were able to fill up their water bottles with natural water, then returned to camp and prepare to head back to River Ridge.

Overall, everyone enjoyed the trip and had a great time. The counselors were incredibly nice and everyone who helped on the field trip was amazing! The sixth grade hopes that the next kids who go to Wyalusing will have a great time, too.
