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## November 2024 Referendum

The River Ridge School District is placing an operational referendum on the ballot for Tuesday, November 5, 2024. The referendum question asks voter permission to exceed the revenue limit. The revenue limit is a State law which limits the amount of revenue the School District receives to pay operating expenses.

The School District's last operational referendum held April 2, 2024 was not approved by voters. The District began budget preparations for the 2024-2025 school year which started July 1, 2024 without the additional operating revenue requested in the April referendum. The School Board made several difficult operating budget reductions for the 2024-2025 school year including:

- Staff and Program Reductions:
  - After Hours
  - High School Science
  - Library, 4K, Tech Ed
- Intra and Extra Curricular Budget Reductions
- General Supplies Reductions
- Technology Budget Reductions
- No Staff Salary Increases
- No Contributions to District Facilities Building and Maintenance Fund

The School District has experienced significant inflationary increases to its operating expenses over the past few years, which have been primarily supported by Federal grants. Those grants are no longer available to the District beginning with the 2024-2025 budget and State revenue limit laws require the School District to ask voters for permission to generate additional revenue through a referendum to exceed the revenue limit.

The November 2024 operational referendum asks voters permission to exceed the revenue limit to pay operating expenses beginning with next year's budget in the amount of \$1,100,000 for the next three budget years beginning with the current 2024-2025 school year and ending with the 2026-2027 school year ("non-recurring).

Approval of the November 2024 Referendum would allow the District to restore some of the staffing and program reductions, offer competitive compensation and benefit plans, provide technology upgrades, contribute to the Facilities Building and Maintenance Fund to lessen the need for a future facilities referendum, and to maintain fiscally responsible budgeting.

## Sample Ballot Language

Shall the River Ridge School District, Grant County, Wisconsin be authorized to exceed the revenue limit specified in Section 121.91, Wisconsin Statutes, by \$1,100,000 per year for three years, beginning with the 2024-2025 school year and ending with the 2026-2027 school year, for non-recurring purposes consisting of operational costs to maintain instructional programs, staffing, technology and facilities management?

## November 2024 Referendum Maintains & Restores District Operations

- Inflationary Impact: operating budget: cost-of living increases, insurance, transportation, utilities, food service, special education
- Staffing: Retain and recruit staff to maintain current levels and provide excellent educational opportunities for all students.
- Programs and services: meet the behavioral, academic, and mental health needs of our growing student needs.
- All day/everyday 4K and Early Childhood programming
- District-wide course offerings
- Student Options: online/specialty courses, dual enrollment, start college now, and early college credit programming opportunities.
- All current Intra/Extra-curricular options for students.
- Technology: maintain students' 1:1 technology platform; replace staff's dated technology resources
- Invest in the Facilities Building and Maintenance fund.
- A fiscally responsible General Fund budget.

## **Estimated Tax Impact**

The School District has received all final information to determine the tax levy and tax rate for the 2024-2025 budget year.

The tax rate impact for the November 2024 referendum is calculated by dividing \$1,100,000 into property values. The calculation below is shown based on 2024 property values.

The tax rate impact for the November 2024 referendum is \$2.60 per \$1,000 or \$260 per \$100,000 property value. The tax impact begins with the December 2024 tax bill through the December 2026 tax bill and expires thereafter.

The District would receive state aid on the referendum amount in the following year. Based on the current aid formula, the State would share in approximately 30% of the referendum amount, which would reduce the tax rate to \$1.82 per \$1,000 or \$182 per \$100,00 property value beginning with the December 2025 tax bill.

## District Options if November 2024 Referendum Does Not Pass

School Board options include:

- Hold another referendum in 2025
- Prioritize operating budget reductions programs and staffing
- Consider larger class sizes
- Impact student academic opportunities reduce class offerings
- Manage Intra/Extra-curricular options for students
- Unable to offer competitive staff compensation and benefit plans – challenges ability to retain and recruit staff
- Cannot Contribute to Facilities Building and Maintenance Fund
- Defer technology purchases and maintenance needs.
- Challenges District's ability to sustain fiscally responsible General Fund budgeting.
- Combination of all of the above
