SCHOOL DISTRICT OF RIVER RIDGE ANNUAL NOTICE OF SPECIAL EDUCATION REFERRAL AND EVALUATION

Upon request, the River Ridge School District is required to evaluate a child for eligibility for special education services. A request for evaluation is known as a referral. When the district receives a referral, the district will appoint an Individualized Education Program (IEP) team to determine if the child has a disability, and if the child needs special education services. The district locates, identifies, and evaluates all children with disabilities who are enrolled by their parents in private (including religious) schools, elementary schools and secondary schools located in the school district.

A physician, nurse, psychologist, social worker, or administrator of a social agency who reasonably believes a child brought to him or her for services is a child with a disability has a legal duty to refer the child, including a homeless child, to the school district in which the child resides. Before referring the child, the person making the referral must inform the child's parent that the referral will be made.

Others, including parents, who reasonably believe a child is a child with a disability may also refer the child, including a homeless child, to the school district in which the child resides. Referrals must be in writing and include the reason why the person believes the child is a child with a disability.





On November 11, 2024 our school and community gathered to commemorate the sacrifice & unwavering commitment of our local veterans. Our River Ridge National Honor Society and other school volunteers organized a heartfelt tribute to show our gratitude.

Our 2024 spotlight veteran was John Horkheimer. John volunteered for the US Army in 1968. He did his basic training in Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri. After basic he was sent to Fort Lewis Washington for 8 weeks of Advanced Infantry Training (AIT). At the end of AIT, he was ordered to Fort Benning, Georgia to attend Non-Commissioned Officers Candidate School (NCOCS) where he trained to lead a mortar squad. He graduated in the top 10% of his class and earned rank of sergeant E5. After officer training he was sent back to Fort Lewis Washington where he oversaw a platoon of 65 men. He finished his military career at the



Savanna Army Depot in Illinois, in charge of Special Services. John has been a member of the Abraham Hickok Wetmore American Legion Post 148 in Bloomington for 52 years. He has been a legion officer for 48 years.

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8th Grade Washington, D.C. Trip

After a year of fundraising, 26 students and 7 chaperones left on Sunday, October 20 for the River Ridge 8th Grade Trip to Washington, D.C. We enjoyed an afternoon break in Chicago at Lake Michigan before heading to Pennsylvania with our first night spent sleeping on the Warco Charter Bus.

We arrived early in Gettysburg, Pennsylvania on Monday, October 21- Day 2. We enjoyed breakfast and freshening up at the Dobbin House, which was one of the 1st Northern locations for the Underground Railroad. We stopped at the Gettysburg Cemetery and saw the exact site where Abraham Lincoln gave The Gettysburg Address. We then visited the Gettysburg Visitor Center Museum of the Civil War taking in the Cyclorama Film and Painting of the Battlefields. then went on a guided tour of the battlefields. We were able to climb to the top of the Long Street Tower, from which we had a 360-degree view of the Gettysburg Battlefields. We then enjoyed lunch back at the

Dobbin House before boarding the bus for Washington, D.C. We arrived at Arlington Cemetery about 2:30 for a guided tour. We viewed the ceremony of the "Changing of the Guards" and four River Ridge students participated in a "Wreath Laying Ceremony" at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier. Congratulations to Hazel Breuer, Lindsay Burmeister, Jackson Cooley, and Carter Wilkinson whose chosen essays earned them this privilege. We visited The Arlington House (estate of Confederate General Robert E. Lee); saw the Eternal Flame at the Grave of President John F. Kennedy, and First Lady, Jacqueline Kennedy; and the grave of Robert Kennedy. We had dinner at the Pentagon Mall and then had a night tour of the Air Force Memorial and the Iwo Jima Marine Corps Memorial. We then checked into our hotel and had a quick swimming time before bedtime.

Day 3, Tuesday, October 22 started with a hotel breakfast before departing for Ford's Theater where

President Lincoln was shot, and the Peterson House where he died a few hours later. A few students peeked into St.Parick's Cathedral where President Kennedy would sometimes attend mass and we visited a couple of souvenir shops. Then we enjoyed lunch at the Ronald Reagan International Trade Center. In the afternoon we had a guided tour of the Nation's Capitol. We also toured the building of the Supreme Court and went to the John F. Kennedy Memorial Center for the Perform-



ing Arts where we saw a 180-degree view of D.C. from its veranda. The afternoon was spent on a guided tour of the Thomas Jefferson Memorial, Franklin Delano Roosevelt Memorial, a walking view of the Washington Monument, the Martin Luther King, Jr. Memorial, the Vietnam Veterans Memorial, and the Vietnam Women's Memorial. We had dinner at the Ronald Reagan International Trade Center and then had a guided night tour of the Lincoln Memorial, the Washington Monument reflecting pool, the Korean War Memorial, the World War II Memorial, and the Washington Monument.



On Day 4, Wednesday, October 23 the group departed the hotel at 7:30 AM for Mt. Vernon - Our First President, George Washington's estate in Virginia. We toured the homes, buildings, gardens, and cemeteries on the estate. We also viewed the original and new tombs of George Washington. We enjoyed the wonderful views of the Potomac River. After lunch at Mt. Vernon. we headed back to Washington, D.C. That afternoon, we toured the Holocaust Museum. We then went to Constitution Avenue to the National Archives where we viewed the Constitution, Bill of Rights, and the Declaration of Independence. We walked to the White House, but only got a limited view as it was blocked for construction in preparation for the January Inauguration. We were surprised with a visit to the Pentagon Memorial, constructed in remembrance of the 184 people who lost their lives on September 11, 2001. We then had dinner at the nearby

Pentagon Mall before heading back to our hotel. The kids once again enjoyed swimming to wrap up the day.

On our 5th and final day, Thursday, October 24, the group enjoyed a continental breakfast and then checked out of the hotel. We went to downtown Washington, D.C., and did a small walking tour of the



General Dwight D. Eisenhower Memorial, the 34th President of the U.S. We also saw the World War I Memorial before heading to our main morning event, the National Museum of African American History and Culture. We then spent our final hour in Washington, D.C. enjoying lunch at the Ronald Reagan building before we boarded thebus forhome. The groupenjoyed an afternoon stop in Virginia at the

Dulles National Airport where we toured the Smithsonian Institution National Air and Space Museum. We then boarded the bus for the long drive back to Wisconsin. We reached River Ridge at 6:00 AM on Friday, October 25, and were greeted by the students' parents and guardians. It was an amazing trip and experience for the River Ridge 8th graders.
