River Ridge Honor Retirees



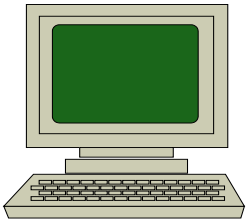

Bullying, Cyberbullying, Hazing, and/or Harassment

The River Ridge School District is committed to providing a safe, positive learning environment for all students, according to board policy. The expectation is that everyone will treat each other with respect and consideration. Actions, such as bullying, cyberbullying, hazing and harassment create an atmosphere of fear and intimidation, detract from the safe environment necessary for student learning, and may lead to more serious violence. Therefore all types of bullying, hazing and harassment are prohibited. Cyberbullying is also prohibited and treated the same as all other types of bullying.

Bullying, cyberbullying, hazing and/or harassment of any student are expressly prohibited in the following settings and/or circumstances:

- During any educational program or activity conducted by or sponsored in whole or in part by the school or school district.
- While being transported on a district provided bus or any other district vehicle.
- Accessed, created, expressed or communicated using any district owned computer, digital technology or system network.
- Sent or passed on through any type of non-district owned technology or personal electronic device while on school grounds, at any school-related or school-sponsored activity, or on district provided transportation.
- Any type of threat indicated to be carried out in a school setting. This includes threats made outside of school hours that communicate intent to be carried out during any school-related or school-sponsored program or activity, or on district provided transportation.

The class should be listed. ENROLL and follow the instructions.

Attention: Any student interested in participating in athletics or any co-curricular activities for the 2019-20 school year.

In order to be involved in any co-curricular activity, not just athletics, **the student and parent/guardian** must attend a mandatory meeting on **August 5, 2019 at 6:30 PM**. At this meeting the student and parent/guardian will sign the code agreement. If a student plans on participating in anything before or during the 2019-20 school year he/she must attend this meeting. This year's meeting will include a speaker along with a brief code presentation.

If unable to attend the meeting, the student will not be allowed to participate until a time is set up to watch the video of the actual code meeting with a parent/guardian. This video will be made available through an online link following the meeting.

Each student must have a physical/alternate year card before participating in any sport. To determine what is needed, go off the last physical. If it was before April 1, 2018, a new physical will be needed. If it was after April 1, 2018 and before April 1, 2019, only an alternate year card needs to be filled out. If unsure, it may be wise to get a physical in the summer before your freshman and junior years. Physical/Alternate year cards are available in the office. This information can be turned into the office anytime. Please put in Mr. Winkers' mailbox.

Along with the co-curricular agreement, the student must pay a co-curricular fee that covers all co-curricular activities for the entire school year. Updated Emergency Cards, WIAA Information Forms, Athletic Trainer Waivers, and Concussion Management Waivers will also be available and must be completed in order to participate in athletics. Finally, all student-athletes will be required to take an Impact Test every other year during their high school playing career. This is a baseline test to monitor head injuries if they should happen.

Summer Food Service Program

Stressing the importance of offering nutritious meals to children during the summer months, the River Ridge School District announces the sponsorship of the Summer Food Service Program.

The Summer Food Service Program (SFSP), which is funded by the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) and is administered by the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction, provides nutritious meals to children during the summer, when free and reduced-price school meals are typically unavailable. Free meals will be made available to children 18 years of age and under. Persons over 18 years of age who are determined by a state or local public educational agency to be mentally or physically disabled and who also participate in a public or private non-profit school program during the regular school year may receive free meals as well.

The following location will be serving the free meals this summer River Ridge School District cafeteria. Breakfast will be served from 7:45 - 9:15 AM and lunch will begin at 11:30 AM. Breakfast and lunch will be served Monday through Thursday July 8 through August 1. Meals are provided to eligible children regardless of race, color, national origin, age, gender or disability and there will be no discrimination in the course of meal service.

“This program fills a void created when school lunches are not available,” said River Ridge School District Business Manager Tracy Stagman. “Helping parents meet the nutritional needs of their children is the strength of this program.”
